Enclosed is the September 2018 Investment Report which shows the financial institutions, types of investment instruments, monthly transactions, current month interest received, and the par and fair market value of investments held. The month-end cash in the bank and petty cash balances are also listed on the Cash and Investment Report. The pie chart (please see chart on attachment A) reflects the investment instruments as a percentage of the total portfolio.

This investment portfolio meets State guidelines and adheres to the City's investment policy. As of September 2018, the City's total portfolio is invested in:

The cash with fiscal agents is restricted as they are funds held and invested by an outside fiscal agent. The restrictions were set forth in the related bond indentures. As of September 2018, 8.712% of the portfolio is restricted.

In summary, the investment portfolio is secured and the City has the necessary cash to pay its bills for six months in a timely manner. Please call me at extension #5060 if you have any questions.

Involved were three passenger autos and a trash bin delivery truck; the truck and one car collided head-on. The driver of the car was trapped and in critical condition. The trash truck driver suffered moderate injuries.

Hearing is set in GG Lyft carjacking

A HEARING has been set for Nov. 15 in the case of a man accused of carjacking a Lyft vehicle in Garden Grove earlier this year.

A preliminary hearing is scheduled for Nov. 15 in the case of a Garden Grove man accused of carjacking, robbing and assaulting a Lyft driver in Garden Grove earlier this year.

According to the Orange County District Attorney's office, Luis Alberto Zaragoza, was charged in Central Justice Center in Santa Ana with felony offenses for carjacking, first-degree robbery, assault with force likely to produce great bodily injury and a sentencing enhancement for the injury.

The hearing will be at 8:30 a.m. at West Justice Center in Westminster. A pre-trial conference is set for Thursday, Nov. 1, also at 8:30. If convicted of all counts, he faces a possible sentence of 14 years and four months in state prison.

Authorities say that on March 10, Zaragoza used the ride-sharing service to request a ride from a bar in Garden Grove. Just before 2 a.m., the Lyft driver arrived, and the suspect allegedly got in the car and told the driver to stop at a McDonald's drive-through.

At that point, Zaragoza allegedly shouted obscenities at the driver, punched and kicked him in the head and dragged him out of the vehicle, then drove away with the auto.

Garden Grove police investigated the incident and arrested Zaragoza on June 11, 2018.





New fire station replaces aging, 47-year-old facility

Previous building, which was built in 1971, was once a 3-bedroom house

Firefighters, civic leaders and residents in Garden Grove celebrated the completion of a new community center and fire station with a ribbon-cutting ceremony Oct. 23.

The facility, at 12232 West St., replaces the original Fire Station No. 6 at 12111 Chapman Ave., which was constructed in 1971. The new 7,680-square-foot building features updated equipment and is much larger than the old firehouse, allowing it to store more vehicles and firefighting tools.

The extra room is a welcome change for crews who had been working 24-hour shifts out of the old station, which had originally been a three-bedroom house, said Garden Grove firefighter and paramedic Ryan Van Wie. He had been based out of the Chapman building for the past four years and said it has struggled to keep up as firefighting practices have evolved over the decades.

"Everything is getting bigger, but the station hasn't grown at all, so it's been tough to STATION » PAGE 5

work out of there," said Van Wie. "There's nine guys (at) that station with three people on duty at a time, so it's very tight."

In addition to larger living quarters and modernized facilities, the recently completed structure includes equipment needed to clean emergency response vehicles housed at other fire stations in Garden Grove. It also retains a central location in the city and has a pair of large bay doors that open on to West Street, making it easier for fire engines to get in and out, according to Van Wie.

Construction also included a new 1,815 square-foot community room with a remodeled playground. The feature was a hit among local parents and children like Salvador Seballos, 23, and his daughter, Aliyah, 4, who moved in about five minutes away three years ago.

Work began on the new Fire Station No. 6 and the adjacent community room in May 2017, and it was funded by a \$5.5 million bond, rather than the city's general fund, said Garden Grove Fire Capt. Thanh Nguyen.

He said that, later, with low interest rates, the city took out a loan to fund the bond in an effort to fast-track the project.

This Saturday, October 27, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., the Garden Grove Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its 16th opportunity in eight years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your pills for disposal to the Garden Grove Police Department, located at 11301 Acacia Parkway, Garden Grove, 92842. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked. The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches.

In April, Americans turned in 475.5 tons (over 900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at almost 5,800 sites operated by the DEA and more than 4,600 of its state and local law enforcement partners.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue.

Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion,
misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly
high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs.

Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family
and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.
