Construction News Week of October 14, 2019

Sewer replacement work on 4th Street is now complete! Over the summer, crews upgraded the sewer system on 4th Street, from Ross Street to Mortimer Street. Utility relocation work is ongoing, but this marks the completion of a significant activity.

Sewer installation continues with activities including excavation, trenching, installation of sewer pipelines, and road work and restoration. Sewer installation work requires temporary parking and lane restrictions. Drivers traveling to downtown Santa Ana and to the Santa Ana Transportation Center from the 5 Freeway will encounter detours on Santa Ana Boulevard to accommodate the work activity. Please leave extra time.

Crews will also continue to perform water pipeline work and storm drain installation work along the project route, which requires temporary lane and sidewalk restrictions.

Access will be maintained for all residents and businesses.

For specific work activities in your area, see the segment overviews and maps below. All scheduled activities are weather permitting and are subject to change.


SEGMENT 1 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Intersection of Harbor Blvd. and Westminster Ave. to Raitt St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 1 construction activities will include:

- Preliminary work at the site of the future Maintenance Storage Facility
- Excavations within Pacific Electric Right-of-Way (PEROW)
- Santa Ana River Bridge construction
- Shoring and rebar installation at Westminster Avenue, near PEROW. A temporary pedestrian detour will be maintained
- · Westminster Avenue Bridge construction

Construction activities for the Westminster Avenue Bridge will require a single lane closure of westbound and eastbound Westminster Avenue, form Enterprise Drive to Harbor Boulevard, for the duration of the work. Only one lane of westbound and eastbound Westminster Avenue will be closed at a time.



SEGMENT 2 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Raitt St. to Parton St.


Over the next two weeks, Segment 2 construction activities will include:

- Storm drain installation and water pipeline work on Raitt Street, from 1st Street to W. Santa Ana Boulevard
- · Water pipeline installation on W. Santa Ana Boulevard, from Raitt Street to Flower Street
- Water pipeline work and testing at the intersection of W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Bristol Street
- · Sanitary sewer work on W. Santa Ana Boulevard, from Bristol Street to Baker Street

Storm drain installation will require a temporary closure of the northbound lane on Raitt Street from 1st Street to Santa Ana Boulevard. Both northbound and southbound traffic on Raitt Street will be shifted to the southbound lane. Temporary parking restrictions on Raitt Street will also be in place from 1st Street to Santa Ana Boulevard.

Sewer installation work will generally move west to east and will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures W. Santa Ana Boulevard. If visiting residents or businesses in the work zone, please

ask crews to assist you in accessing the driveways. They can pull plates over the work area to facilitate entering and exiting.



- · Potholing for storm drain installation on Main Street, from 3rd Street to W. Santa Ana Boulevard




SEGMENT 5 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

If visiting residents or businesses in the work zone, please ask crews to assist you in accessing the driveways. They can pull plates over the work area to facilitate entering and exiting.

About the Project

OC Streetcar is the first modern streetcar project to be built in Orange County and will serve Santa Ana's historic and thriving downtown, which includes federal, state and local courthouses, government offices, colleges, an artists' village and a thriving restaurant scene. Expected to begin carrying passengers in 2022, it will operate along a 4.15-mile route that connects the Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center (SARTC) and a new transit hub at Harbor Boulevard and Westminster Avenue in Garden Grove.



Now there's one more masterwork to see: A 40-by-40-foot version of "The Last Judgment" was installed earlier this month.

As with other pieces in the exhibit, the new addition is very close to the size of the original at the Vatican in Rome. A smaller version of "The Last Judgment" has been part of the exhibit since it opened and will remain on display.

"The Last Judgment" depicts the Second

Coming of Christ.



2019 Legislative Session

2019 Legislative Session – Key Highlights

- Started the year with a new Governor that has bold, ambitious housing goals (3.5 million new units by 2025), link housing production and transportation funding
- Housing also a top priority for the Legislature
- More than 150 housing and land use related bills introduced
- SB 50 (Wiener), SB 4 (McGuire), AB 1279 (Bloom) 2 year bills
- Other key bills were amended to significantly reduce impacts
- Two Budget Trailer bills
 - \$2.5 billion in funding to address California's housing and homelessness crisis
 - Establishes incentives to encourage cities and counties to increase housing production
 - Establishes a process for a court to determine that a city or county has complied with housing element law
 - Establishes a process for a court to determine that a city or county has complied with housing element law

Affordable Housing & Infrastructure

SB 5 (Beall) Affordable Housing and Community Development Investment Program.

Creates a local-state partnership to provide up to \$2 billion annually to fund state-approved affordable housing, infrastructure, and economic development projects that also support state policies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, expand transit oriented development (TOD), address poverty, and revitalize neighborhoods. This measure restores RDA-type ongoing financing for these important projects.

Tenant Protections

SB 329 (Mitchell) Discrimination. Housing. Source of Income.

Expands "source of income" definition to include state, federal, or local funds, and housing vouchers.

Position: Request Signature

Status: Signed by Governor

AB 1110 (Friedman) Rent Increases. Noticing.

Expands existing notice requirements to 90 days if the rent increase is more than 10%.

Position: Request Signature

Planning and Zoning

SB 330 (Skinner) Housing Crisis Act of 2019

Declares a statewide housing crisis and for a five-year period freeze nearly all development related fees once a developer submits a "preliminary" application, including essential project specific fees. Developers would have up to 2 1/2 years to begin construction and not be subject to any new fee.

Planning and Zoning

AB 1763 (Chiu) Density Bonus. Affordable Housing

Greatly expands existing Density Bonus Law by requiring, at the request of a developer, for 100 percent affordable housing projects, a city or county must award an 80 percent density bonus and four incentives and concessions. For 100 percent affordable housing projects within one-half mile of a major transit stop a city or county would be required to allow unlimited density, four incentives and concessions, and up to three additional stories.

Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU)

SB 13 Wieckowski) Accessory Dwelling Units.

Prohibits local jurisdictions from imposing any impact fees on ADUs less than 750 square feet, and limit the charge on ADUs over 750 square feet to 25 percent of the fees otherwise charged for a new single-family dwelling on the same lot. Prohibits replacement parking when a garage, carport, or covered parking structure is demolished or converted into an ADU. This measure also prohibits owner occupancy requirements.

Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU)

AB 68 (Ting) Accessory Dwelling Units.

Significantly amends the statewide standards that apply to locally-adopted ordinances concerning accessory dwelling units (ADUs). Changes include: prohibits minimum lot size requirements; requires at least 850 sq.ft. per ADU; and requires approval within 60 days.

Status: Signed by Governor

AB 881 (Bloom) Accessory Dwelling Units.

Prohibits a local jurisdiction from requiring a property owner live in the main house or one of the accessory structures. Requires local agencies to ministerially approve ADUs on lots with multi-family residences and within existing garages. Adds a definition of "public transit" to mean a bus stop, bus line, light rail, street car, car share drop off or pick up, or heavy rail stop.
