Dear City Council and Traffic Commissioners,

I would like to convey my sincere thanks on behalf of the Cook Elementary community for the installation of the left turn signal at Woodbury and Brookhurst. An additional thanks for adjusting the timing of the lights. This thank you is long overdue, as this occurred at the beginning of this school year.

Our journey of seeking solutions for safer traffic patterns for our community began with the Safe Routes to School Community forum in 2017. Our community worked together with representatives from the City of Garden Grove and the KOA Corporation. Through this collaborative effort, most of the suggestions for enhanced safety were implemented immediately; in our parking lot, red curbing to increase traffic flow, "Blind Person" signage for the blind students in our corner of the community, and much more.

All of these elements made an positive impact, however the impact of the left turn signal installation has been remarkable! I still marvel at the smooth flow of traffic during the morning and afternoon entrance and dismissal times. There is no longer a long stream of bumper to bumper traffic, with annoyed parents and the occasional person unaware of the horrible traffic during this time who happened to get caught in the mess. Now traffic continually flows. I can't tell you very grateful our staff, parents and neighbors are for the significant impact this signal has had. I realize the huge expense and effort this must have been the city to undertake and I wanted to be sure that all involved in the process of installing this signal realize how very grateful we all are. Each of you who supported this process have made a huge difference to the members of our community.



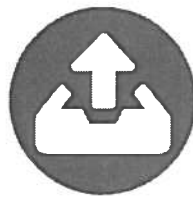

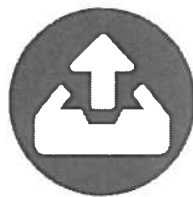

Council OKs 15-year parks plan

Goal: Develop, maintain and rehabilitate green spaces

The Garden Grove City Council recently approved a 15-year master plan that will set the framework for the planning, maintenance, development and/or rehabilitation of city parks and facilities. The Parks, Recreation, and Facilities Master Plan can be accessed

online at ggcity.org/parksplan through the Open Government portal at ggcity.org/open-gov.

Improvements recommended to the public and the Garden Grove City Council include updating irrigation systems, security lighting systems, park restrooms, and playground equipment.

The Master Plan will provide a systematic approach to the implementation of parks and recreation projects, services, and programs based on available budgets, identifies grant opportunities and other funding sources in order to prioritize and address evolving community needs.

Public input on the Master Plan was obtained through an extensive community-wide engagement process conducted earlier this year which included an online multi-language survey and public meetings.

The Parks, Recreation, and Facilities Master Plan can be accessed online at ggcity.org/parksplan or through the Open Government portal at ggcity.org/open-gov.

Improvements recommended by the public and the Garden Grove City Council include updating irrigation systems, security lighting systems, park restrooms, and playground equipment.

The Master Plan will provide a systematic approach to the implementation of parks and recreation projects, services, and programs based on available budgets, and identify grant opportunities and other funding sources in order to prioritize and address evolving community needs.

Public input on the Master Plan was obtained through an extensive community-wide engagement process conducted earlier this year which included an online, multi-language survey and public meetings.

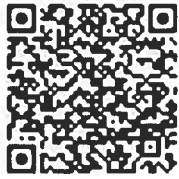

League-Sponsored Bond Agency Issues More Than \$69 Million in Tax-Exempt Bonds for Affordable Housing in Napa and Lompoc

November 4, 2019

California Statewide Communities Development Authority (CSCDA) announced the issuance of \$69 million in tax-exempt and taxable multi-family affordable housing bonds for Charter Oaks Apartments in Napa and Arbor Square Apartments in Lompoc.

The League's co-sponsorship of CSCDA continues to be a significant benefit for League members.

About Charter Oaks Apartments

Charter Oaks Apartments is an acquisition and rehabilitation of 75 multi-family affordable housing apartments by Charter Oaks Apartments II, LP. The project sponsor is Bayside Communities. Charter Oaks will continue to be 100 percent affordable and provide one-, two-, and three-bedroom apartments to low-income residents in Napa.

CSCDA and Bayside partnered with Citibank and Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe, LLP to provide the \$39 million in tax-exempt multifamily affordable housing bonds. The project will undergo an extensive interior and exterior renovation ensuring that residents have an updated, safe, and affordable community to call home for years to come. The financing of Charter Oaks will maintain the affordability of units for low-income tenants for 55 years.

About Arbor Square Apartments

Arbor Square Apartments is an acquisition and rehabilitation of 126 multi-family affordable housing apartments by LIH Arbor Square, LP. The project sponsor is LEDG Capital. Arbor Square will continue to be 100 percent affordable and provide one- and two-bedroom apartments to low-income residents in Lompoc.

CSCDA and LEDG Capital partnered with Deutsche Bank and Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe, LLP to provide the \$30 million in tax-exempt multifamily affordable housing bonds. The project will undergo an extensive interior and exterior renovation ensuring that residents have an updated, safe, and affordable community to call home for years to come. The financing of Arbor Square will maintain the affordability of units for low-income tenants for 55 years.

Webinar Highlights Program to Use Excess State Land as Potential Sites for Housing Development

November 4, 2019

The League of California Cities hosted a webinar, in partnership with the California Department of General Services (DGS) and the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), to unveil state-owned parcels in cities across the state that may be viable for housing development and the process by which such development would occur.

DGS and HCD are tasked with implementing Governor Newsom's [Executive Order N-06-19](#), which aims to identify state-owned property that is viable for housing development and is in excess of any foreseeable need.

League President and Yountville Mayor John Dunbar, one of the webinar presenters, reinforced the League's eagerness to work in partnership with the Administration on implementing the Executive Order.

President Dunbar reminded cities that this Executive Order provides an opportunity for state and local governments to work in collaboration to help determine the viability of building cost-effective housing on excess state property. He shared an example of how Yountville worked with the Department of Veterans Affairs, DGS, HCD, and the Governor's Office to bring housing to under-utilized sections of the 600-plus acre Veterans Home campus.

DGS Deputy Director Real Estate Services Division Jason Kenney and HCD Specialist Division of Financial Assistance Meghie Tabar led the webinar. Kenney and Tabar updated attendees about the progress achieved to date and that the two state departments collaboratively narrowed down the 44,000 excess pieces of state property to 100 sites using specific methodology to identify only sites that are most ideal for housing development.

Many local governments have already reached out and suggested sites in their city and county, with some proposing co-development projects to make sites more viable.

Executive Order N-16-19 Background

[Executive Order N-06-19](#), signed Jan. 15, 2019 and ordered DGS, HCD, and the California Housing Finance Agency (CalHFA) to collaborate to identify and prioritize excess state-owned property for sustainable, innovative and cost-effective housing developments.

Since then, DGS and HCD identified and prioritized excess state properties and then determined which sites would be potentially suitable for affordable housing development. The resulting [GIS-enabled map](#) is searchable, fully interactive, shows each site identified in the inventory and includes a "heat map" overlay indicating where housing is most needed in California. Going forward, DGS will release Requests for Proposals to begin developing affordable housing at selected sites. Developing entities will receive a long-term ground lease from the state and would build, own and manage the housing they develop, subject to oversight from the state.
